a Treatise on Cholera.

Armagh is now almost entirely free from Cholera. Only two patients were in Hospital on Saturday last, and no new cases have occurred since.

The Newry Police Commissioners have decided on lighting the town with oil in preference to gas.

Lord Charleville has kindly taken on himself the payment of the tythes of Ardcanney parish, in this county, to the Rev. S. Jones, Prebendary.

The walls of Liverpool are covered with bills, offering work and good wages in London to all journeymen builders unconnected with the Trades' Union.

We are gratified to learn that Thadeus R. Ryan, of Castlejane, Esq. is recovering from the dangerous gun-shot wounds inflicted last Monday by assassins, near Kilfrush, and we sincerely hope the authors of this daring outrage will be promptly brought to condign punishment.

An inquest was held yesterday at Barrington's hospital, by the Mayor, on a little boy named Michael Grady, who died of a fractured skull inflicted by a blow of a stone a month before. Verdict of wilful murder against a person or persons unknown.

A canoe while boarding the Ann Worthington last Monday upset alongside, when Timothy Behan, a Limerick Pilot, was drowned while attempting to get on board; also, a man named Keating, a boat owner from Carrigaholt. One man escaped by swimming to the canoe and placing his hands on either side, succeeded in steadying her till picked up by Jas. Martin's pilot boat—there were three in the canoe. The accident happened off the light house of Kilcredane.

Mr. Michael Hogan, publican, was found dead in his bed on Thursday morning, at his house, O'Brien's Bow, Broadstreet, having retired to rest in good health the night previous. The Mayor held an inquest on the body. Verdict—Died by the visitation of God.

The following fourteen convicts on route from Castlebar to Cove, arrived here yesterday in charge of Ensign Long and party of the 37th Regt. John Cusack, Thomas Bourke, and John Keane, sheep stealing, to be transported for life; Francis Dowd and Thomas Grevy, for violent assault, seven years; Patrick Carroll, John Givnelly, and John Joyce, manslaughter for life; John Williams, and Michael Butler, cow stealing, for life; John Murphy, Thomas Molowny, and James Feeny, larceny, for 7 years; and Thomas Spron, robbery on the highway, for life.

Monday last, the convicts sentenced to transportation at Kerry Assizes and Killarney Sessions, were transmitted under an escort of the 69th Regiment, from Tralee jail to the convict hulk at Cove. Previous to their removal those convicted at Killarney, succeeded in concealing a quantity of the limestone broken by the prisoners sentenced to hard labour, which, on their arrival in Killarney, and while passing the house of Mr. D. Murphy, who was the principal sufferer by their depredations, they simultaneously flung at his windows, and smashed them to pieces. This spirit of revenge has been attended with disagreeable results to the culprits, as on their being lodged in bridewell for the night, they were double-ironed, and placed in the solitary cell, on half allowance of bread and water; and a statement of their conduct signed by three Magistrates, has been forwarded to the governor of
