A Letter from London by the last mai!, advifes, that the return of Lord Auckland (Mr. Eden) to London, from his commercial negociation at the Court of Madrid, fooner than was expected, was not the confequence of his having been able to execute his commission in a short time, but on the contrary, owing to unfurmountable (or more properly unforeseen) difficulties having unfortunately occurred while he was treating with the Ministers of his Catholic Majefty. This was the Revolution in France; by which the French Envoy at Madrid, (without whose concurrence the Spaniards would not go one step) not receiving any instructions from his Court, on account of the distracted state of the Gallic Councils, peremptorily refused his acquiescence- to any of the articles pending at the time. His declaration of course threw cold water on the bufinels, to that nothing was afterwards agreed upon but a few preliminary flipulations of little moment. Thus, this famous negotiation, from which fo much was expected, turned out a mountain in labour.
