## SHOCKING AFFAIR

### IN COUNTY LIMERICK

#### Head Constable's Suicide.

Abbeyfeale, Friday

The people of Abbeyfeale were shocked to learn that Head Constable Matthew Hogan, who has been stationed here for some time past, and who was a most popular official committed suicide this morning by shooting himself through the ear with a revolver. Head Constable Hogan, who was always of a very happy and agreeable disposition, and the very last man who would be thought capable of such a rash act, was on sick leave for the past week, but was considered to be almost well again until the terrible event referred to came with such startling suddenness. On yesterday he transacted business as usual, and at 9 o'clock this morning was visited by Sergeant Glynn, who advised him to get up; that he appeared as well as usual. He chatted for some time with him, and intimated his intention of shaving. About ten o'clock Acting-Sergeant Orr went to his room, and this time he asked him to send the servant to him with some hot water. Shortly after the Acting-Sergeant leaving him, Head-Constable Griffin, who is doing substitute, was engaged in the office up stairs when he heard the report of a shot, but attributed it to some of the men practising at the yard target. The barrack servant then proceeded to his bedroom with the shaving requisites, and was horrified to find Head-Constable Hogan dead, with a revolver clapped in his right hand, and a wound in his right ear. Dr. McCarthy and Father Halpin, C.C., were immediately on the scene, but death had been almost instantaneous.

A motive for the tragic death of Head-Constable Hogan has been discussed in many quarters here to-day, which was market day in the town, and much credence has been given to a vague suspicion, true or otherwise, that an official communication from his authorities in connection with a recent prominent prosecution in West Limerick was not altogether unconnected with his indisposition, and incidentally with his sad and very much deplored death. The police, however, are most reticent about the matter, and afford no information whatever on the subject, which, it is expected, will be satisfactorily cleared up at the inquest. Dr. Ambrose, the Coroner for the district, is away, and a difficulty has arisen in finding a substitute. It may be stated that during his short service here no official in his position succeeded in meriting so much popularity in so short a period.
