The whole being under the command of Colonel Tandy, as General for the day, and Colonel Smith, as Adjutant General, marched about one o'clock through the city to the South Wall, where being formed into one line, they fired three volleys and gave three cheers in honour of the important and glorious event, being joined in the latter by a most incredible multitude of citizens of all ranks who attended on the occasion, their acclamations rent through the plan of a mock engagement, and formed several other manœuvres previous to return to town about four o'clock in the evening, and notwithstanding the great conourse of people who attended, there did not lightest accident occur, and joy and happiness beame in every countenance.
