**DEATHS.**

**DEATH OF COLONEL CROSBIE.**—With feelings of regret we undertake to announce the demise of the above named Gentleman, who departed this life at his seat at Ballyhigue Castle, on Saturday last, after a long, distressing, and painful illness, in the 63d year of his age. Colonel Crosbie's name has, for many years past, filled a large space in the annals of Kerry. He served as one of the Representatives for the County in the several Sessions of Parliament which were held from the year 1797, inclusive, to the year 1820, except during a short interval, commencing in the year 1807, when the late Henry Arthur Herbert, Esq. of Muckross, was returned, and continued in the Representation until 1812, when he voluntarily resigned, and Colonel Crosbie was again elected. He was, in the year 1802 (on the resignation of his relative, the Earl of Glandore), appointed to the command of the Kerry Regiment of Militia. Having, therefore, held the rank of 1st Lieutenant Colonel of that Regiment, and of his head was active in the suppression of the horrible Rebellion of 1798, having personally the command of that loyal and gallant corps, with the Knight of Kerry, as (2d Lieutenant-Colonel) in command, when they defeated the rebels and their French auxiliaries at Killina, and released a number of Loyalist prisoners, who, otherwise, would probably have been massacred. On the lamented death of the Earl of Glandore, Colonel Crosbie was appointed Governor and Custos Rotulorum of the County, which rank and station he held to the hour of his much regretted death; having survived the amiable and beloved partner of his happiest days only a few months. He was truly an honourable man. In private and domestic life, he was universally respected and esteemed as a good and indulgent landlord, a generous and sincere friend and patron; his Castle was the abode of genuine hospitality and friendly kindness and courtesy.
