The remains of Mrs. Samuel Spaight who died at Rathmines, on Wednesday, passed through this city on Monday, for interment in the family vault at Six-mile-bridge. The procession was composed of many valued friends, and the numerous tenantry of the deceased.

A man named Butler, servant to a gentleman near Castle-Connell, in a fit of insanity hanged himself from a tree on Sunday last. He was a native of England.

A man named David Casey committed suicide by cutting his throat with a razor in Mill-street Bridewell, county Cork, on Thursday, where he had been lodged for cow stealing on that day.

On Saturday evening, Patrick Grady, residing at Kilsaley, in the County of Clare, and a weaver by trade, put an end to his existence by strangulation. It appears that the unfortunate man was haunted with the apprehension of misery and destitution even in these plentiful times. He and his family, consisting of a wife and four children, during the earlier part of the year were inmates of the Ennis Workhouse, and left it voluntarily. At the time first stated, a small boy was the only person in the house with the deceased, whom he sent on some trivial errand to a neighbouring house. On the boy's return he found the unfortunate man hanging from the upper beam of his own loom, and life quite extinct. An inquest was held on Sunday by Thomas Whitstone, Esq. Coroner, and a verdict returned, that the said Patrick Grady put an end to his existence in a state of temporary insanity.
