The Constabulary of Ireland are this week engaged receiving an account of the number of patients admitted into the different Houses of Industry, infirmaries, and Hospitals for the years from 1832 to 1841, with a statement of deaths in each Asylum. The return is connected with the census.

The Quarter Sessions of the division of Rathkeale, commenced at Newcastle on Monday, before R. Tighe, Esq., Assistant-Barrister. There was but one notice of Registry served, no appearance. Three ejectments entered. The number of civil bills entered was three for the barony of Kenry, none for Coshma, for Upper Connelloe 500, for Lower Connelloe 100. Total for trial 603.

John Walsh, a prisoner in the County Gaol, for the murderous attack upon Patrick Slattery's house, near Kildimo, last June, on which occasion the Police had a desperate struggle with the assailants, died in prison, of typhus fever, aggravated by the wounds received in that sanguinary rencontre. Messrs. Crips, Vokes, and Studdert, held an inquest on the body. Verdict accordingly.

A Repeal meeting was held in Rathkeale on SUNDAY, at which Mr. Patrick Naughten, of Coo Lomin, presided. There, too, this new mode of "raising the wind" was a signal failure if the almost total absence of every person calculated to give it a tone of respectability could in any wise make it so, "My dear Ray," as a matter of course, "played first fiddle" on the occasion, with his usual acknowledged skill and execution; and after treating the company to the oft' served dish respecting English persecution, with the host of attendant *et ceteras*. he slyly appealed from their feelings to their pockets, and wound up his discourse by the interminable "*send up your names and a shilling*" Several speeches from others followed, all harping on the same string, and all regarding the present agitation as a "*Ray of hope*" to the fallen fortunes of our country. Still, all was a complete failure!—to be sure, under the influence of a temporary excitement, the poor unsophisticated peasantry shouted; but this was all!—those whose opinions could carry weight—who could understand, and laugh at the arguments adduced, declined identifying themselves with the movement, or acting the puppets at Mr. O'Connell's bidding in this "new way to pay old debts." Mr. Ray's mission as far as it has gone, has been eminently unsuccessful—that it will continue to be so we predict, and that such is its only desert considering the impracticability of a Repeal of the act of Union and the delusiveness of the project, is our firm
