Preacher on the Methodist Establishment in this city. The ultimity  
of this gentleman's desires was the Church, on which account he  
severed himself from the Wesleyan Connexion and entered  
Trinity College, in order to prepare for his entrance on the  
Ministry, for which he would be fitted early in the ensuing year—  
but human expectations are vain; an over-anxiety in storing his  
rich and fertile mind, with resources to enable him better to dis-  
charge the high and important functions of that office on which

weak, and just as he was nearing the goal and attaining the

world." He died in full confidence of the saving merits of his
