CORK, LIMERICK, AND GALWAY RAILWAY.
NOTICE.

WE are authorised to state, that the name of the
EARL OF GLENGALL has been erroneously
inserted in the Prospectus of the Cork, Limerick, and
Galway Railway, his Lordship not being connected
with the Company.—Copied from the LIMERICK
CHRONICLE, of Wednesday, the 22nd of October,
1845.

The name of Mr. Henry Comerford, the only Mer-
chant connected with Galway, who has also been put
forth as a supporter of this bubble Company, has
written to have his name immediately withdrawn:
Others will follow Lord Glengall's and Mr. Comerford's
example, in the course of the week; thereby proving
to the Public how this notable scheme was got up, and
by what unscrupulous means it is attempted to palm
it as a bona fide one upon the Public. Not one of
the Managing Committee, put forth as locally con-
nected with, and thereby supposed to carry on its pro-
ceedings at this town (Galway,) have any connection
with it, or its Merchants, whatever, and are Gentle-
men related to the Dublin Solicitor, which easily accounts
for their presence on this *nomini umbra* Committee.
With the exception of those parental family relatives,
there is not a single Galway or Clare Gentleman upon
this Flash Committee, thereby proving the hollowness
of, and distrust in, the entire scheme, except one, of
the euphonious name of Canny, of whose existence no
one before ever dreamt, but who will be remembered
when George Hudson and Watt are forgotten.
