A Caution—The very existence of the poor
depends upon potatoes; yet we too often see,
thro' indolence and neglect, large quantities
totally destroyed by frost. This season pro-
mises a continuance of hard weather, and it
is earnestly recommended to all farmers to lay
in, and carefully protect their crop.—It is
hoped this caution will be promulgated to the
illiterate poor, by their respective Pastors.

Potatoe Barm, which by long experience has
been found the best for making good Bread.—
Two pound boiled Potatoes, of the dryest kind,
the more mealy the better, bruise them with a
spoon till they become fine, then pour on them
two quarts of boiling Water, by degrees stirring
it with a spoon to make it mix smooth, put to
it four ounces of brown sugar, after mixing it
well, strain it through a hair sieve, when luke
warm, add thereto four or five table spoons full
of good solid barm, let it lie in a crock for two
hours before the fire, till it ferments, stirring
it occasionally, put it into a cool place for 24
hours.—One naggin of this Barm will serve
four quarts of flour, the dough must stand nine
hours in a warm place, before you make it into
loaves for baking;—this Barm will hold good
for two months.
