Martin, London, No. 5262," bought of O'Shaughnessy, George's-street.

Patrick Farrell, labourer at the Wellesley Bridge works, died in Barringtons Hospital on Saturday night last, of a fracture in the head, from wounds inflicted after a drinking match the Sunday morning previous at Ballinacurra, where he and some more quarrelled about the score or reckoning.
