" On this occasion, the Archbishop of Aix was the decided champion of the Church, by displaying the most inexhausted fund of national and ecclebaftical history, by the most minute, but fingularly instructing reference to antient deeds, charters, concessions and privileges granted from Charlemagne to the present zera. Several illustrious foreigners were present at the debates, and fo great were his powers, fo deliberate, and dignified was his reasoning, that admiration was incessant, and a reverence for his virtues univerfally proclaimed-his opponents were even his warmest panegyristshe offered three hundred millions in the name of the Church, and twenty millions a month for a limited time-he friends of a Regal Authority, and splendid patronage, heaved many a figh ! - but Cataline was at the Gates, and not a moment was to be loft.
