**THREE SAILORS DROWNED.**—On Saturday night, D. Duncan, mate of the Jessie of Rothsay, Ninian M'Kerdy, of the same sloop, and Robert M'Kerdy, of the Anne Worthington, were drowned whilst stepping from Fisher's Quay to their Vessels lying there. It appears, that they, with other sailors, were drinking at a Public-house, and, it is supposed, they were inebriated, when the fatal occurrence happened. The body of Duncan was found on Sunday morning, and the bodies of the M'Kerdys, who were twin brothers, were got on Monday morning.—After an inquisition had been taken by the Mayor on the three corpses, they were decently interred in one grave at Mary's Church-yard, amidst the tears of a concourse of their shipmates. The funeral cavalcade exhibited a truly melancholy spectacle; and it was rather a singular ordination of Providence, worthy of reflection, that the ill-fated brothers should have entered and passed out of this terrestrial state together.

On Monday, an old woman was rolled over by a car on Thomond Bridge, and the greater part of one ear torn away by the wheel. Her life, at the moment, was in the most imminent danger; the driver, in the interim, was seated on the shafts of his car, utterly careless of the consequence, which renders his negligence more culpable.

A girl was accidentally shot by a boy, playing with a musket, on Friday night last, in Palliskerry.

A man, of the name of John Dillane, returning from the fair of Listowel, on Wednesday last, was way-laid by some ruffians, who beat him most desperately and fractured his skull. He knows two of the party whose names he has mentioned; unfortunately, his life is despaired of. The Listowel Police are in quest of them, and it is hoped they will be apprehended.

A man, named John Sullivan, was apprehended in Listowel, on Saturday, by two of the Constabulary Force, for sheep stealing.

A murder and robbery was committed near Kanturk, on Saturday night, the victim a carman with loading for Cork. The body was found on Monday, dreadfully disfigured, and the coat pockets cut off.

In consequence of the diminution of breaches of the peace in this City, the Mayor and Magistrates resolved on Monday, to reduce the days of holding Petty Sessions to Wednesdays and Saturdays, in each week.

A boy named Murphy, received a kick in the lower part of the abdomen, yesterday in John's-street, from a brute in the human-form. The injury sustained was so great that it was necessary to convey him to the County Infirmary, where some favourable hopes are entertained of his recovery.

Samuel Matthews, a young man, had his leg fractured yesterday, by a barrel which he was lowering into a cellar in Mary-street, rolling over him.

On Friday, on board the Sarah of Greenock, lying in the Clare river, at the moment of firing off a gun, a spark reached a flask containing several pounds of powder, which instantly exploded, and, we regret to say, severely burned Captain M'ulloch and Mr. Macbeth, jun. of this town.
