REMITTANCES TO ENGLAND, &c.

On Thursday, the Mayor held an Inquisition at *Pe-
 trick's-Well,* in the Liberties, on the body of *Michael
 Nunan,* who was killed by falling from a horse in a field.
 —Verdict accordingly.

Great alarm was created in Ennis, on Monday, by the
 chimney of Mr. P. Daly, publican, taking fire, and com-
 municating to the adjacent. Prompt assistance was ren-
 dered by the inhabitants, police, and a detachment of the
 84th Regiment, who succeeded in suppressing the flames,
 after partial damage to the premises and furniture.

A person named Patrick Shehan was yesterday com-
 mitted to the County Gaol, charged on oath, before *Edw.
 Croker, Esq.* and *Walter H. Burgh, Esq.* with having
 attacked the house of the Widow Condon, near *Fedamore,*
 on the night of the 1st instant.

Yesterday, the Mayor and Captain Drought, committed
 to the City Jail, *Thomas O'Donnell,* a lawyer, convicted
 under the Combination Act, and sentenced to three
 months imprisonment, for refusing to appear to support
 his Information, which he preferred against several of his
 fellow tradesmen, who he stated prevented him from
 working.

Christopher Galwey, Esq. of Killarney, having been
 robbed by his gardener of a quantity of plate, a man
 named *John Harrington* was arrested in Cork, this week,
 with part of the property, and committed to prison.

John Dillane, who was waylaid near *Listowel* and
 cruelly beaten, as mentioned in our last, has since died
 from the effect of his wounds.

The Custom House of *Tralee* was infested with crowd
 pressing to exchange the old silver coin, on Tuesday,
 which was the last day appointed by the Proclamation for
 that purpose, and yet, it is believed, no small portion of
 the currency remains still in circulation. No six-pence
 were issued, and upwards of £3,000. was exchanged in
 notes. A soldier, attached to a recruiting party in the
 town, who made himself particularly active and accom-
 modating, by conveying the money in and out to the
 country people, eloped in the course of the day with the
 entrusted to his care, and has not since been heard of.

Yesterday, a large sum of the New Silver Coins
 near £30,000, arrived at the Custom House, under
 of the Commissariat from Dublin, preparatory to exchang-
 ing the Old Bank Tokens on the 5th December next.

The approaching assimilation of the currency of the
 countries is looked to with a feeling of apprehension by
 many. It should be generally understood, that the price
 for demanding payment for, or exchanging the old bank
 notes in circulation, after the 5th January, is unlimited.

A Detachment of the 23d, Royal Welch Fusiliers
 has lately embarked at *Plymouth,* to join the Regiment
 at *Gibraltar.*

Detachments of the 42d (which Regiment lately em-
 barked for *Gibraltar,*) and of the 88th which embarked
 for *Corfu,* still remain in Ireland; they are, however,
 daily expecting to embark to join the other Divisions
 their respective Regiments.

Forty Recruits have joined the 58th Regiment
 Dublin, during the last ten days.

The 1st Battalion of Royals, the 25th Regiment, and
 the 2d Battalion of the Rifle Brigade, have not yet em-
 barked from Ireland for their respective stations; the
 former for the West Indies, and the latter for *Malta.*
