On appeal the Recorder of Dublin has disallowed 75l a year, excess paid by the parish of St. Andrew to the two Curates, Rev. Messrs. Nevin and Blacker.

Mrs. Blaney Dungan, of Church-lane, whose husband was formerly an eminent druggist in Dublin, was burned to death on Monday, by her clothes catching fire at the grate.

The Moffat transport, from Cork, with the 60th King's Royal Rifles on board, arrived out safe at Gibraltar the 31st October last.  
The first division of the 36th Reserve, under Captain Murray, marched on Tuesday, and the head-quarters under Major Lord George Hervey, on Thursday, for Cove, to embark for Spike Island, to relieve the 65th Reserve, who proceed to Fermoy.  
The detachment of the 36th at Mitchelstown, under the command of Lieutenant Burrows, marched on Saturday, to join head-quarters at Spike Island, being relieved by an equal party of the 65th Regiment.  
The Reserve Companies of the 52d Light Infantry have arrived at Chichester.  
The 90th Reserve Companies have moved from Gosport to Chichester.  
Two Companies of the 67th Regiment, commanded by Captains Warburton and Foley, marched into Newry, last Thursday. The grand division of the Regiment marched in this day, from Mullingar.  
Major-General Sir Colin Campbell, commanding the Western district, England, has removed his head-quarters from Portsmouth to Winchester, during the continuance of the rustic disturbances.  
The 9th Lancers have left Kensington for the disturbed districts. The Riding Establishment of the Cavalry at St. John's Wood barracks occupies the station of the 9th Lancers at Kensington.  
One Captain, two subalterns, three serjeants, and 60 rank and file, of the 47th Regiment, from Portsmouth, have sailed in a Steamer for Southampton, on route to Winchester.  
Sir John Willoughby Gordon, Bart. the now Master-General of the Ordnance, in room of Field Marshal Beresford, is Colonel-in-Chief of the 23d Royal Welch Fusileers, and Representative for Launceston.  
Sir John Beckett, Judge Advocate General to the Army, is succeeded by Mr Robert Grant, M.P. for Norwich.  
Lord John Russell, M.P. is appointed Paymaster-General of the Army, in place of John Calcraft, Esq.  
The office of Quarter-Master-General of the Forces is vacant by the promotion of Sir Willoughby Gordon to the head of the Ordnance department.  
The office of Lieutenant-General of the Ordnance Department, as hitherto held by Lieutenant General Lord Robert E. H. Somerset, is abolished by the new Ministry.  
Robert Vernon Smith, Esq. M.P. for Tralee, has accepted office as one of the Lords of the Treasury, and the writ for a new election was issued, on Monday last. Mr Smith will be re-elected immediately.  
The Hon. George Ponsonby having accepted office as one of the Lords of the Treasury, the representation of Youghal is now vacant. The writ is issued for a new election.  
Lord Forbes, M.P. for the County Longford, is appointed Private Secretary to the Marquis of Anglesey in Ireland.  
Lord Viscount Valletort, Colonel of the Cornwall Militia, is appointed one of his Majesty's Aides-de-camp.
