On Wednesday night, two soldiers of the 23d
Regiment, on their route from Ennis to Dublin,
were most cruelly maltreated by some ruffians in
the English town, in this city, when one of the
soldiers ran to his lodgings, brought out his piece,
and fired among them, happily, however, without
doing any injury.

The inquest on the body of Dennis Kerly (as
stated in our last,) terminated on Thursday, at
three o'clock, when the Mayor, who is also
Coroner, read the depositions, and summed up the
evidence for the Jury. The verdict was a
special one, in the following words:—"We find
that Dennis Kerly died in the night of Monday,
the 27th day of November; inst. in consequence
of gun shot wounds heretofore received by him,
and we have reason to believe that he was of the
party who attacked the house of M. Ward, in
the South Liberties of this City, on the night of
Wednesday, 22d of November, inst." In the
course of the investigation, the timely and spirited
conduct of Mr. Fitz-Gerald and his brave
assistants drew from the Jury, and every person
present, the most marked approbation.

On Tuesday evening, an inquest was held by
Thomas Sampson, Esq. on the body of Mary
Bleach, which was found in a bog-hole at Bally-
donehan, Co. Clare, with three large cuts on her
head. A verdict of Willful Murder against
persons unknown was returned.

On Sunday morning last, two of the party who
fired on Patrick Ranahan, some months back, in
the Parish of Bourney, were brought into the goal
of Roscrea, by the exertions of Corker Wright,
Esq. of Rutland. Ranahan's wounds were so
dangerous, that Doctor Hargrove, of Roscrea,
had to amputate his thigh at a most perilous height.
The man has been, fortunately, for some time,
perfectly restored to health, and will, consequently,
be the prosecutor at the approaching Assizes for
the County Tipperary.

On Thursday morning last, the watchmen
posted in Denmark-street, stopped two men, whom
they had observed prowling about for some time.
On being searched at the Watch-house, they were
both found to be armed, and had in their possession
a quantity of slugs, cartridges, and some flints.—
The Right Worshipful the Mayor having examined
the watchmen, and the prisoners not being able to
give a satisfactory account of themselves, com-
mitted them to the City Jail. His Worship gave
the watchmen five shillings (a fine inflicted by him
