Mr. John Walker, Civil Engineer, has resigned the situa-
tion of Surveyor of this county, it is understood, from a

could not be properly executed in the short time allowed by

(£300 a-year,) is inadequate to the extent of duty required
in such a large County as Limerick, where the expences of
the Surveyor are necessarily great. Mr. W. Horne, Civil

Walker for the present, but the latter gentleman does not
leave the county, for since his intention of resigning the
situation was known, he has been engaged by several large
landed proprietors, in the improvement of their estates.
