## The Limerick Chronicle.

## LIMERICK

By particular Defire there will be a Drum a the Affembly House next Thursday Evening

On Thursday last at Oxford, the honorary degree of Matter of Arts was conferred on Samuel Silver Oliver, Efq, of Limerick, Ireland; and that of Doctor in Cvil Law, on William Mann Godschall, Esq; of Westonhouse, in Surry.

Extract of a letter from a gentleman at Nevi, to his correspondent in Cork, dated Oct. 24.

". A most dreadful earthquake happened in a town belonging to the Pope, called Citadi Castello, about 60 miles from Rome, towards Tufcany; this town was one of the richest in the Pope's territories, and contained about 15.000 inhabitants. The first shock was felt at It o'clock on Wednesday, the 30th of September A. M. it was preceded by no figns attendant on earthquakes; it lafted two minutes, when the whole town was involved in a whirlwind of fmosk and dust from the falling of houses, churches, and palaces. At the first alarm great numbers of the inhabitants fled towards Rome and faved themselves. The first dreadful shock was followed by many more, and in the intervals nothing was heard but the crushing of buildings, the few remaining were fo shattered as not to be known. Many people were dragged from the ruins, (as the Italians express it) semiwiwi, and in a short space of time 1000 have been found dead, but the number of unhappy fufferers is supposed to exceed confiderably, as a much greater must have suffered. This town was not the only sufferer, five villages in the country were fo totally defroyed that not one stone was left upon another; besides four convents, in one of which the greatest part of the Monks were killed. This account may be relied on, as I have taken it from an authentic one, printed at Rome a few days ago. - The earthquake still continues in the neighbourhood of Ciradi Castello."

A duel was fought on the 26th of May, by Capt. Thomas Baker, and Jacob Brown, Efq; of Camden, South Carolina: they fired together, at the distance of ten yards, and both fell; Capt. Baker was shot through the body and expired in the field, in about twelve minutes. Mr. Brown was shot in the lower part of his belly, and the ball was cut out of his lest fide, but he died twenty hours after. When these gentlemen had fallen, they conversed calmly together and exchanged forgivenels.
