Wednesday the Mayor held an inquest upon the body of Catherine Peyton, otherwise M'Mahon or Wilson, who died in Hospital of a severe fracture on the forehead, produced by a stone, with which she was struck by one of three fellows who broke into her residence at Roherbuoy by night. Verdict of wilful murder against said persons.

The Mayor held a third inquest last Thursday, on the remains of a man, name unknown, who was found in the water near Coonagh bank, in the North Liberties, in a very advanced state of decomposition. The left leg of the unfortunate man was broken—Verdict, found drowned.

Yesterday, at the Police Office informations were ordered against John Byrnes, for stealing three pigs and some geese from Daniel Drew, of Clarina—against two persons named Mulqueeney, for stealing a heifer from Patrick Higgins.

Shots were fired into the residence of Mr. Wm. Wilkinson, at Galbally, in this county, on Saturday night, after the family had gone to rest, and a Rock notice against taking land left on the premises.

Lord Mulgrave has offered £50 reward for the fellows who set fire to the Rev. Mr. Hogg's residence, in Leitrim, and attempted to murder that clergyman.

Michael Kean was the name of the man found dead in a dyke near Six-mile Bridge last week.

Grace Bennett, wife of a labourer from this county, dropped dead in Carrick-on-Suir, on Saturday last. Friday night she lodged at the house of a man named John Shea, and in the morning when he found that she was ill, he forced her out of bed and turned her into the street, where she fell dead ! Verdict—" We find that deceased came by her death by the visitation of God, she being hurried into it by the inhuman conduct of John Shea."

On Wednesday, a fire broke out in the stores of William P'ce, Esq. in George's-street, Waterford, and destroyed property to the amount of £5000.
