SERIOUS OUTBREAK IN WORKHOUSE OVER FOOD.

Police Attacked—Numerous Arrested. A serious outbreak occurred among hundred and fifty male inmates of Belknap Workhouse, near Sutton, Surrey, last night. The men refused porridge for supper and commenced throwing crockery, knives, and...

The 86 inmates arrested were this morning brought up at Sutton charged with refusing to conform to the workhouse regulations, and doing wilful damage. Two men charged with assaulting the labour masters were committed to prison, and of the remainder of the prisoners were discharged, and the others were sentenced to three months' hard labour.

EARTHQUAKE DISTURBANCE IN GLASGOW.

Later particulars show that last night's earthquake, over Glasgow, was much more violent and severe than was originally reported. Distinct disturbances took place, but for no personal injuries resulted.

The caretakers in all the principal streets formed the impression that the safes had exploded, the police at one bank had supposed burglars.

BEDOUIN REVOLT MASSACRE OF GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS.

Jerusalem, Wednesday. An eye witness of the Bedouin revolt says several companies of Turkish regulars were distributed among the tribes in the neighbourhood of Gordon to effect the disarmament of the Bedouins. The tribesmen rejected the authorities, and attacked the regulars, annihilating them, and capturing six officers and families in Kerak.

THE "WARATAH."

The Board of Trade Inquiry into the appearance of the liner "Waratah" off South Africa, of the liner "Waratah" last year was open to-day.

Counsel, outlining the case, said that a new one, on her second voyage from London. There were aboard 92 passengers, 119 of a crew, and she had every fitness. Counsel said one passenger on the Waratah at Sydney left her because he thought her top heavy.
