Melancholy Accident—This morning, about
one o'clock, during a violent storm from S. S. E.
the large Chimney of Captain Hickman's house,
in Clare-street was blown down; which, falling
upon the roof, broke it in with a dreadful crash,
and carried down all the back-rooms to the
ground floor. Captain Hickman's family, are
in England, and the house was occupied by a
cook, named Mary O'Connor, two children,
one eight, and the other eighteen months old,
belonging to Mr. Hickman's servant, and an
old woman, named Mary Keily, their grand
mother. The Cook was dug out of the ruins dread-
fully bruised, and there is but little hopes of her
recovery; but the poor old woman with the two
infants were killed. The parents of the children
are with their master in England.
