LONDON CATTLE MARKET.—(Yesterday).—There was more
cheerfulness in the beast market, and a shade higher prices
have been obtained, but values were irregular; 5s 8d was
reported as quite the top figure for best Scots; Norfolks
from 5s 4d to 5s 6d per stone, and useful beef from that
quarter could be had at less; trade lay principally with car-
case butchers. Sheep rather dearer, with more life in trade.
Lambs in quiet demand, at 7s 6d to 8s per stone. Calves
slow of sale. Pigs lower. Prices—Beef, 4s 6d to 5s 8d per
stone; mutton, 5s to 6s 2d; veal, 5s 6d to 6s 4d; pork, 4s
to 4s 10d. Supply—Beasts, 1,560; sheep, 9,610; calves, 10;
pigs, 30. Of which were foreign—Beasts, 660; sheep, 50.

LIVERPOOL CATTLE MARKET.—(Yesterday).—There were
1,210 beasts and 5,267 sheep and lambs at market, including
some very prime foreign beasts, which brought good prices.
Sheep and lambs in slow demand, owing to the high prices.

clipped, 9d to 10d; lambs, 35s to 50s each.
