

man of the County and arose in this way.—An appellant who is the proprietor of a large dairy farm situate about 3 miles from the city, insured his dairy stock with the defendants as "Farm dairy Cows" whereas the defendants contended that from their being housed at night, their manner of feeding, and their being milked three times each day, they were "Town dairy Cows" and liable to a higher premium than that paid by the defendant. The amount claimed was 16/10s.

Mr. Murphy, counsel for the appellant, contended that the terms town dairy cows, applied to cattle kept in houses all the year round, such as in London, Liverpool, and other great towns, who never saw a green field, or eat anything off one, but were fed with artificial food; whereas the appellant's cattle were fed on grass land, on a large farm three miles distant from the city.

The appellant was examined and deposed that his cattle were fed on grass from April to November, after which they were given steamed turnips, chopped straw, and bitter bere, with hay, and were housed; he sent some quantities of milk to market, and made fresh and firkin butter of the remainder, which was sold in the city.

The Lord Chief Baron held that this was a "dairy farm," and not a "town farm," and reversed the decree of the court below, with costs and costs of counsel.
