**THE HARBOUR BOARD DEBT.**

TO THE EDITOR OF THE LIMERICK CHRONICLE.  
 SIR.—Having had the advantage of comparing my views  
 with those of some of the most intelligent and wealthy  
 citizens of Limerick, on the subject of the proposed ar-  
 rangement of the harbour debt, I think it well to state  
 briefly and simply a few facts and figures which will  
 speak for themselves, and which struck me as being  
 much more convincing than mere assertions or vague  
 hypothesis:—

At present the Harbour Board is indebted for—

Loans	£179,000
Arrears of Interest	44,000
<b>Total</b>	<b>£223,000</b>

According to present arrangement the inter-  
 est of the above principal sum at 4l. per  
 cent. amounts to 7,200l. per annum,  
 equal in 50 years to ... 360,000

Which in addition to the above sum amounts  
 to ... 533,000

Which sum would be liquidated by the pay-  
 ment of 4,000 per year, in fifty years,  
 equal to ... 200,000

Thereby giving us a free port, and the bal-  
 lance, ... £38,3000  
 which would be expended here instead of going into  
 the English Exchequer.
