## THE OUTRAGE AT GLIN.

An inquest was held on Saturday evening by Dr. T. H. Hannigan, Coroner for West Limerick, on the remains of John Dillane, who was struck with a stone on the leg on the 25th October, and who died on Friday evening.

Mrs. Dillane, wife of the deceased, deposed that he and her son and herself were in their house in the Mall on the 25th Oct., at 7.30 p.m., when their window was broken by stones. She ran behind a board, her son ran under the bed, and her husband went out the back door to see who was throwing stones. He returned after a short time, and was sitting down by the fire when a stone came through the window, striking him on the leg below the knee, knocking him off the chair. He roared that his leg was broke. She ran for the police.

Constable Somerset deposed to finding deceased lying on the floor with his leg wounded. There were stones lying about.

Dr. C. McDonnell deposed that he found Dillane lying on the floor with his leg broken. He treated him in the ordinary way, and was hopeful up to a short time since that he would be all right again. Gangrene set in, however, and pneumonia supervened, with fatal results. Deceased was a heavy man and advanced in years.

Mr. John Conway, (foreman of the jury) said their evidence would of course depend on the doctor's evidence.

A verdict in accordance with the medical testimony was returned.

## THE "COLLINGWOOD" IN THE SHANNON.

His Majesty's first class battleship "Collingwood," 10 guns, 9,500 tons with a full complement of officers and men on board, has arrived in the Shannon and taken up anchorage in Tarbert Roads. The "Collingwood" built in 1882 is the smallest first class battleship in the Navy. For a number of years she has been doing guardship duty at Bantry and other stations on the Irish Coast.
