SAD FATALITY IN THE CITY.

A very sad fatality occurred in the city last evening. It would appear that at about five o'clock, John Enright, a ship-carpenter, aged about 76, residing off High Street, became suddenly ill shortly after he had entered Mr. O'Brien's public-house, in Catherine Street. Some men who were in the establishment at once came to his assistance and conveyed him outside the door. Dr. O'Sullivan, William Street, was sent for and arrived in a few moments, but the poor fellow was then dead. Death was due to heart disease. Deceased was a man of most temperate habits and extremely industrious as well. Sergeant Murphy had the remains removed to the Morgue, pending an inquest.

An inquest was held this afternoon by Mr. Coroner DeCourcey. The evidence of Dr. O'Sullivan showed from the man's appearance and the fact that he had suffered from rheumatism, he believed that death was due to heart affection. The jury entered a verdict accordingly.

COUNTY COUNCIL PRINTING.

In the House of Commons Mr. Joyce has asked the Chief Secretary whether his attention has been called to the contractors to whom the Limerick Council have given the contract for their printing; and whether steps will be taken to secure that the provisions of the Fair Wages Resolution of this House are given effect to in the carrying out of the contract.
