## CIAL TELEGRAMS).

### IN THE EAST.

**OF THE TURKS TO SEIZE THE OTHER SIDE OF THE DANUBE.**  
 The commander-in-chief has given orders to the Turkish side of the Danube, without military force to be seized.

**BOMBARDMENT OF ODESSA.**  
 A telegram received in Paris announces the commencement of the bombardment of Odessa.

**BOMBARDMENT OF RUSTCHUK BY THE RUSSIANS.**  
 A report was spread at Belgrade that a report was spread at Belgrade that Rustchuk was being bombarded by the Russians. The confirmation of the rumour has yet to be received.

**DELEGATE TAKEN PRISONER BY THE BELGRADE REGIMENT.**  
 A telegram states that a Belgrade regiment has taken a Russian delegate prisoner. He is confined for three days, and a ransom of two thousand ducats was paid for his release.

**BRIDGE BURNED AROUND BARBOCCHI AND SALATZ.**  
 A telegram states that the bridge at Barboocchi and Salatza has been burned by the Russians. The neighbourhood is inundated, the troops declaring that the water is deep in some places.

**MOVEMENTS IN NORTH-WESTERN BULGARIA.**  
 The Gazette says that 35,000 breech-loading rifles have been sent into Bulgaria, where a rising will take place. The Russians have crossed the Danube.

**MOVEMENTS AT BURBOSCHI.**  
 Debats says that six mitrailleuses have been sent to Burboschi.
