FATAL STABBING AFFRAY AT CAHIRCONLISH.—
Patrick Kearney, stated to be a small farmer, died this morning from, it is supposed, the effects of wounds inflicted upon him some days ago. It seems he had a dispute with a labourer named John Hannan, in the village of Cahirconlish, near which place he resided, but the quarrel was confined to words. Subsequently deceased was attacked on the road, and, as alleged, stabbed in the abdomen. Dr Keayes was soon in attendance on the injured man and pronounced his life in imminent danger. John Hannan was arrested shortly after the occurrence and remanded by Col Perse, R.M.

METHODIST CHURCH.—The Limerick district meeting was held a few days since, when the Rev Samuel Weir presided, and Rev S T Boyd, and R Little conducted the business as secretaries. Rev R T Tracy, who entered the ministry in 1817, and is now the oldest member of the Conference, was unable, through infirmities, to attend; but sent to, and received from the meeting, a cordial greeting. The membership had suffered during the year from emigration and death; but the various departments were hopefully reported on. There are twenty-nine separate trusts, and the estimated value of the property is £20,060. The Rev S Weir was elected to the Standing Committee.
