The Emperor of Germany in return for the conditions obtained for the Grand Dake, binds himself to procure the consent of the Empire to the arrangements concerted by the mediating powers.

The First Conful engages to unite his influence with that of the Emperor of Russia to procure for the Grand Duke and his heirs the Elecforal Dignity.

The Convention is to be ratified within twenty days, or fooner, if possible. It is signed by Count Cobenzel, Joseph Bonaparte, and Count Markof, the Ruffian Minister.

It is reported on the Continent that, beside this public Convention, feeret articles have been entered icto upon various other points. It is observed, in confirmation of this opinion, that the new Convention trenches upon the arrangements made in favour of the Elector of Bavsria, without affigning him any reparation whatever. It is faid, that Austria has formerly agreed to the erection of Tufcany into a Kingdom, to the extention of the French boundaries in Italy, to the annexation of Parma and Placentia, and to the interference of France in the affairs of Switzerland, though contrary to the treaty of Luneville. It is certain at least that these objects have given rife to discussion; and it is probable that some

Convention will be concluded, to fanction and acknowledge what has been done. Feb. 3]-Last night, a little before 12 o'clock a most alarming fire broke out at Mr. Hamilton's Printing Office, at the top of Falcon-Court. The private house of Mr. H. as well as his valuable Printing Office, are entirely destroyed, and the 3 adjoining houses materially injured. The property loft is estimated at neer 11,000! not above 3000l, of which was injured. We are happy,

Feb. 4]-Yesterday Lord Hawkesbury gave notice to the House of Commons, of the intention of Ministers to move for the renewal of the bill forbidding payments in specie by the Bank. We are not furprifed that the continuance of this meafure should be found necessary; but those who the most ardently supported it last spring, when it passed, must now find their predictions woefully falsified. We were then assured, that no doubt could be entertained of the capacity of the Bank to renew its payments in specie on the 1ft of March, 1803, and fo fanguine were fome on the fubject, they expected the Bank would be able to refume its payments even before that period. In confequence a power was inferted in the bill to enable the Bank to make payments before the expiration of the reftriction.
