"IRELAND'S RESOURCES.—Ireland has 3,000,000 acres of bog-land which supplies an enormous quantity of admirable fuel. The average depth of peat on this is twenty-five feet—in some cases over forty feet. The water from the rivers of Ireland has an average fall of 129 yards. The average daily fall of water (129 yards) into the sea, is 68,500,000 tons. A 884 tons falling twenty-four feet in twenty-four hours is a horse-power; Ireland has an available water-power, acting day and night, from January to December, amounting to 1,300,000 horse-power—or, reduced to three hundred working days of twelve hours each, the available for industry represents over 3,000,000 horse-power."
